



Shehecheyanu and New Beginnings of All Kinds

This time of year, when school has begun and the High Holidays are nearly upon us, is always a season of new beginnings, but this year especially so. This is the September/October edition of "The Tifereth Israel Forum," which means that I am now one month into my tenure as the senior rabbi of Congregation Tifereth Israel and have been a resident of Columbus about the same amount of time. Not surprisingly, there is much that is new in my life. When we start something new, or do something for the first time, Jewish tradition teaches that there is a b'racha, or blessing, to be recited - in this instance the b'racha of Shehecheyanu. We thank God "Shehecheyanu, v'kiymanu, v'higi'anu lazman hazeh - who has kept us in life, sustained us and enabled us to reach this glorious day." Needless to say, my family and I have recited this blessing together on a number of occasions over the past few weeks. We said it when we hung the mezuzahs on our doors, when the kids started school, and even went for it when we got the wireless internet up and running in our home!

As it happens, this rather well known b'racha is one that we will recite together as a community many times over the coming weeks in our celebrations of the chagim, the fall festivals. With each lighting of candles to begin a holiday, Shehecheyanu is recited. When kiddush is chanted in the evening, Shehechyanu comes along with it.

When we hear the sounds of the shofar on Rosh Hashanah, *Shecheyanu* precedes it and when we sit in the sukkah for the first time we will say those same words, as we will in many other instances during these next few weeks.

As I think about all of these "Shehecheyanu moments" from the past six weeks and the ones just around the corner, I am reminded that ultimately the point of this b'racha (and you might say all b'rachot) is to encourage each of us to both acknowledge and be grateful for all of the special moments in our lives, from the more unusual (like starting a new job or hanging a mezuzah) to the ones that come around again and again (like hearing the shofar and sitting in the sukkah).

In this particular season of new beginnings, I want to say how grateful I am to be here and to be part of this incredible congregation. My family has been truly touched by the excitement and anticipation of our arrival - the calls, emails, visits, meals, and all kinds of help that we have been blessed with as we have settled in. We have felt at home in Columbus from day one and have felt only more comfortable every day since.

May the New Year bring us the first of many, many moments together to be grateful for the gifts that life has to offer and may we be blessed to recite *Shehecheyanu* together for many years to come.

Wishing us all a *Shanah Tovah Umtukah*, a sweet and happy new year.



Boker Tov Preschool Comes to Sunday Mornings at Tifereth Israel

Congregation Tifereth Israel is growing its Jewish learning opportunities for its youngest members.

Boker Tov Preschool, launched in August, meets one Sunday a month from 11:30 am to 12:30 pm to introduce children aged 5 and under to foundational Jewish values such as tzedakkah (charity), tikkun olam (repairing the world), and todah (gratitude). There is no cost to participate.

"We wanted to go beyond the holidays and really offer families something they could take home and talk about around the dinner table," said Rabbi Alex Braver. "Even very young children can begin to understand and internalize the building-block concepts when presented properly. And for those too young to understand, we hope to give their adults some language and tools to begin incorporating the practice of these concepts into their

children's daily lives."

Boker Tov Preschool meets at the same time as the Samuel M. Melton Religious School and the Tifereth Israel Hebrew High School so parents of both older and younger children can participate. Families are encouraged to come every month, but are welcome to "drop in" at any time.

"Adding a preschool program really rounds out the educational opportunities Tifereth Israel offers," Rabbi Braver said. "It brings us another step closer to our goal of providing truly life-long Jewish learning."

Buy your family a lulav this year. The \$50 or so you spend, if you use it right, will be well worth it. It is the symbol, to be used repeatedly, of the holiday that follows our High Holidays. Put it together, bless it, shake it. Own it.

Thirty-six years into my tenure at Tifereth Israel, I have come to realize that there are some things I thought I told you already, so of course you know them. But, it turns out, you were "absent that day" or may need a reminder. There are some basic things that need to be said over and over and over again.

May the year that is about to begin be your best, most inspiring, and most joyful yet. From a Jewish perspective, that relates directly to how closely you pay attention and participate.

Just about everyone finds their way into this progression for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. As with many things, that is both a blessing and a curse. Shabbat and festivals enable us to reassert control over our emotional and spiritual lives, and that benefits everyone with whom we come into contact.


Why I love Tifereth Israel






