

Coming Back

At first, as summer begins, it's just a faint whisper, a thought in the back of our minds. But as the months go by, as we pass through Tisha B'Av and commemorate the destruction of the Temple, as we move into the Hebrew month of Elul, it gets louder and more insistent. Finally, it is as loud as the blast of the shofar. Shuvah: come back. Turn away from your mistakes and your habits that only hurt you. Return to the person you are meant to be and to the people you've hurt.

Come back to this cycle of holidays that draws us in with its rich world of symbols and songs and tastes and rituals. Come back to do the work we say we're going to do every year, only to discover anew each fall that the work remains incomplete.

This year, the call of shuvah – come back — is even stronger, as we begin to come back to our pre-pandemic lives. COVID-19 still exists and is still a real threat - and, at the same time, we are experiencing the first flowering of our redemption from this difficult time. As we've each begun making our own choices about how to reemerge into in-person public life, I'm proud of the way our staff, lay leadership, and re-opening committee have navigated these complex medical, scientific, social, and moral questions, providing our community with a cautious but optimistic pathway back to learning, praying, and acting together in the physical world. We'll continue to chart a path forward, taking so much of what we've learned about virtual engagement into our new world of "hybrid" online-and-in-person gatherings.

I know that the thought of coming back inspires both excitement and

anxiety. I am thrilled to return to in-person prayer, which provides an energy and kavannah (focus) that I still have trouble mustering with online davening, despite doing it for a year and a half. And at the same time, I've grown into being the father of a toddler in the work-at-home world, and I'll have to figure out how

to balance being out of the house more often with being the type of dad I want to be. I'm sure that you have your own unique mixture of hopes and fears, too, when you hear the call of shuvah — come back! But neither we nor the world to which we're returning will be quite the same, and we'll learn to navigate these challenges and embrace these joys together.

Answering the call of shuvah requires work and preparation. That's true both for our return to the building and in-person gatherings, as well as our return to our better selves. The summer is our time to begin gearing up for what's to come – to pack our spiritual bags for this journey of return that will take us through the preparatory Hebrew month of Elul, the Jewish New Year, the Day of Atonement, and finally through the joy of Sukkot and Simchat Torah. Though the summer tends to be a quieter time, there are still so many ways to pray, learn, and act with us as a community: Come to in-person services, join a virtual lunch-and-learn, volunteer with one of our many committees, or just find some quiet time to reflect on what you've learned over this difficult past vear.

Then, we can get ready to come back together.



The Power of One and the Power of Many

Relationships are complicated. They often are not linear, but they can lead us on a journey to experience the richness of life.

A long time ago my wife Sharon had a friend (and still does) named Laura. Laura was married to a man (and still is) named Jerry. I didn't really know either one of them back then, but somehow our wives brought Jerry and me together and we quickly realized that we shared a couple of things. First of all, we shared a love for golf. Second, we shared an appreciation for scotch and bourbon. And thirdly, we shared a curiosity about Judaism. Jerry's formal understanding of Judaism and davening skills were far more advanced than mine, but we shared this curiosity, nonetheless.

Jerry and I struck up a friendship very easily. We golfed regularly and were always mindful of the need to "hydrate" together after our game. In time, we, along with our spouses and children became friends as well, often going out to dinner or to a film and eventually began to share many of the Jewish holidays together.

One day, just a few months after Jerry and I had met, he was informed that his mother was diagnosed with terminal cancer and didn't have long to live. Sadly, soon after this, she passed away.

Two mornings later, I received a call from someone saying that Jerry was

at his home and trying to get a minyan and asking if I would be able to stop by to help make a minyan. I said of course. You have to realize that my communal religious experience at this point was not nearly as rich as Jerry's, but I was honored to help a new friend during one of the most difficult times anyone of us will experience. During the next several days there were far more people than the minimum 10 required but I eagerly and gladly wanted to be there so Jerry could say kaddish. I had never gone to a friend's home to say kaddish but found the experience as beautiful, meaningful, and spiritual as anything I had ever done before as a Jewish person. Jerry's mom had unfortunately passed away but in a very profound way had helped create a loving and deep relationship between two families.

The relationship grew and even though I had not gone to shul regularly in the past, Jerry encouraged me to come more often, to learn, to read Torah, and to become a part of a community. One thing led to another and a short time later, I was asked to join the Tifereth Israel board. Well, you know how that ended up! The point is, always be open to asking someone to become involved and if they ask you, consider saying yes.

People lead us to people, friends lead us to friends and relationships lead us to relationships. Here's to creating more and deeper relationships for us all at Congregation Tifereth Israel.

My name is Amy Tannenbaum, and I've been a member at Tifereth Israel since 2013, serving on the board since 2018. My journey began as a first generation American, born in Cleveland and raised by immigrants from the former Soviet Union. Going to The Ohio State University brought me to Columbus, and I've been here for the most part ever since. Having been raised very secular, I was always curious about Judaism and wanted to be more engaged in practicing Judaism and more connected to the community. This curiosity began while I was in college and intensified after returning to Columbus after a few years away.
