Things Are Looking Up

Well, last year you only had two dozen people in the sanctuary," someone told me over the course of the High Holidays. "This year you had 100 ... so things are looking up!"

They were right — despite all the last minute changes, restrictions, logistical challenges, and a last-minute Internet outage that almost derailed Kol Nidre (!), things have indeed been looking up. Hundreds of members of our Tifereth Israel family were able to attend at least some of the holidays in our sanctuary this year, and hundreds more watched online. We combined elements of our sanctuary service with our alternative services to create a sacred experience that felt rooted in tradition and infused with new ideas and reflections. We sang together, learned words of Torah together, remembered loved ones together, and reached deep down inside ourselves to explore our capacity for change. In the face of rapidly changing circumstances, we did what we all do best – join together for warm, meaningful, and joyous Jewish moments.

That we managed to pull this all off is only thanks to the hard work and dedication of scores of people: staff and lay leadership, Torah and d'var Torah readers, volunteers who dropped off gift bags and collected books. And that's not even mentioning the members of the COVID Reopening

Task Force, who made incredibly difficult, time-

sensitive decisions with wisdom and

And then of course, there's the entire congregation who trusted in our communal leadership to safely and meaningfully guide us all through this sacred journey ... and who were willing to read through dozens of emails with updated sign-up procedures!

What a privilege it is, as a rabbi, to lead these services — to be on the bima representing a process that takes dozens of people months to put together, and to fully trust that all the logistics have created a solid foundation for our spiritual work to be most effective. Thank you.

And then, the rest of the year begins. Our Judaism 101 and 201 classes have launched for the year, along with new editions of Dinner, Drinks, & Drash and Lunch & Learn, as well as the return of our weekly classes and study groups. Religious School is back in session (and back in person!), bringing joyous Jewish learning into the building each week. We look toward Chanukah celebrations together and with our families. The rhythms of the year begin again ... and even if we're still not entirely past the pandemic, at least things are "looking

Friends, Family, and Minyan

A long time ago, before the pandemic, there were a handful of people I knew that used to talk about Congregation Tifereth Israel as being too big, impersonal, and not very welcoming. Although I didn't agree with them. as that was not my experience, I did understand what they were saying. If you were not from Columbus and with deep roots at Tifereth Israel, there was a with all the majesty of the large main sanctuary, the history of many families' multi-generational involvement with the shul, and at least at that time, hundreds of people all gathered together.

Shortly after that, a little over five years ago on a sunny afternoon in May. my mom passed away in a hospital in Cleveland. Needless to say, I was devastated. Although my mom was in her 80s and had struggled with health issues much of her life, it was still a shock, a blow, a loss and incredibly scary to think about life without my mom. And while I have some extended family. I don't have a large family and I really didn't have anyone in Columbus to grieve with other than my wife and son, who were both incredibly supportive. And so I began to go to Shacharit services most mornings and sav kaddish for my mom. This was a very different experience than being in the main sanctuary for Shabbat. It was obviously much smaller, more intimate, and each person made an effort to get to know me.

At first, it felt a little awkward as there were a

number of people who I didn't know and while the services, were similar to the Shabbat services, they felt different, too. I also was not particularly fond of getting up an hour earlier, go to services and then go to my office, but over time I grew chance that you might feel overwhelmed accustomed to the new routine and in a relatively short period of time this became my new routine.

> One of the first things I realized, after the initial numbness of losing my mom lessened, was that I was not alone, both literally and figuratively. There were several other people each morning who were also sharing their losses and stood up for their loved ones, as well, and by extension, my loss.

> I looked forward to seeing this small group of warm, welcoming people every morning. Often there would be a new person who we would welcome the same way we were welcomed in the past. Many of the people I met during that very sad and lonely time in my life have become long-term friends. It's hard to lose someone you love, but by coming to minyan you realize you are not alone, others do care and there is much you can do to help others, often just by your presence.

I hope to see you at minyan sometime soon to share the beauty of every day, but also to support each other. That's what friends and family do.





Why I love Tifereth Israel

Growing up, my family moved around a lot, so, by the time I was in college, we had lived in 7 different states. My parents Earl, z"l and Janet, z"l always made sure to find a synagogue to join wherever we moved, to anchor our family's spiritual lives, and to quickly become part of a community. In all but one city, that place was a conservative shul.

My father moved to Columbus in 1980, to begin his tenure as executive director of Jewish Family Services. Several months later, my mother, brother, and I followed, together with our dog, Tzimmes. My parents joined Tifereth Israel and quickly became involved in committees: education for Dad, choir and sisterhood for Mom. My brother and I were both attending colleges out of state, so we did not join TI at that time. When I later returned to Columbus, my wife Tracee, and I joined Tifereth.

Within a few years, I came to terms with my identity as a gay man, so Tracee and I divorced. At that time, in the mid-1980's, I honestly felt there was no longer a "place" for me in the

TI community. So, I joined another local temple. I have been singing in its choir for more than 30

Yet, I still felt a connection to Tifereth Israel, where I had attended services and had been active through the years. While my mom continued to be an integral part of TI, I gradually started becoming more involved, and was welcomed as if I had never been gone. I found comfort in attending minyans to say kaddish for my parents after each of them passed away. I was embraced by long-time members and met new friends just starting their "Jewish Journeys."

Attitudes have certainly changed since the 1980's, as so many members have realized that they have LGBTQ relatives who still want to be part of the community. I am honored to chant Torah, Haftarah, and lead minyans. So, I love Tifereth Israel because it "feels like home," a place where we are all welcomed and valued.

Tifereth Israel has always been a part of my life. Growing up in Columbus, I attended Hebrew School at Tifereth, where, in addition to the knowledge I gained, I also made lifelong friends. I have especially fond memories of learning Israeli dances in the lower social hall. I remember David Davidovich teaching us dance steps while he simultaneously played his accordion and danced!

While living and working in New York City, I met my prince charming Mike, and there was no discussion – we would get married in Columbus at Tifereth Israel. I had been returning to Columbus regularly and attending services at Tifereth. It was important to me that the ceremony happen at my "special place." Our New York friends and Mike's family traveled to Columbus for the big event. Rabbi Berman and Cantor Chomsky officiated. The sanctuary was decorated beautifully and I always remember that magical moment

As Membership Committee Co-Chair, I enjoy welcoming new members into our congregation and watching as they become involved. And, it makes me happy to see new members making friends and acquaintances at Tifereth, just as I did as a child and continue to do now as an adult.







