About Our Board

People often ask me what the Tifereth Israel board of trustees is doing. It's usually the start of an interesting conversation that often ends with a comment similar to "I had no idea you guvs were doing that." I think it's helpful for people to have an understanding of what their board is doing and how those activities might affect them. So, one of my goals is to have periodic check-ins with our congregation on some of the issues and topics our board is involved

Our board typically meets monthly and takes off the Jewish holidays. We currently have 50 board members, including all past presidents and a representative sample of our congregation including young members who are just getting started, people with young and older children, empty nesters, single people, and those who have been congregants for many generations. The clergy, executive director, and education director attend most board meetings, but have no voting rights.

The responsibility of the board is to follow our constitution and to help establish and support the mission and purpose of Congregation Tifereth Israel. Our three primary legal duties are known as the "duty of care," "duty of loyalty," and "duty of obedience." And, not to get too wordy, our current constitution states "The mission of this Congregation shall be to establish and maintain a Synagogue and such educational, religious, social, and recreational activities that will help further the cause and objectives of the Synagogue and Conservative Judaism.'

Stepping back for a moment from the structural and legal considerations, I want to share with you two items that

were recently presented at our most recent board meeting. Please

understand that much of the work that is done on behalf of our congregation is performed at the committee level and then shared with the board.

The first was to share with the board that I appointed past president David Stein to chair our Security Committee and that Lauren Levy, Larry Stoltz, and others have agreed to serve. In a strange sort of irony, this was done on the very sad anniversary of the Sandy Hook Elementary School shooting. Unfortunately, threats remain all around us and as a Jewish organization we need to be particularly vigilant. David is assembling a committee of dedicated volunteers to study what else we can do to help insure our congregation's safety.

The second item I presented was to announce that Mark Levy had agreed to chair our Cemetery Committee and that Eliott Good, Greg Margulies, Mike Jacobson, Tammy Mott Forrest, Arnie Good (representing the Tifereth Israel Foundation), Howard Larky and Jan Lyddon had all agreed to become committee members. This group will help to perform important and sacred work that will benefit generations to

These are just two items covered in our most recent board meeting, but like everything else our board does, I am deeply grateful for and appreciative of their hard work, insight and devotion.

Please know that I will periodically share future updates as to what our board is doing and feel free to check-in with me if you have questions or suggestions.

Why I love Tifereth Israel

I was born in Montreal, then moved to Akron, then to Atlanta, and then, finally, to Columbus in 1990. My first son, Jeremy, was born in 1991, and my second son, Jordan, was born in 1994. Rabbi Berman officiated at both sons' brit milah. My parents, aunt, and sister were already members at Tifereth and Rabbi Berman was so warm, gracious and welcoming, I just had to join. We attended Shabbat services every weekend and I became a regular "greeter."
